

ABSTRACT PREPARATION

The deadline for Abstract submission is April 15, 2016.

Prior to submitting the abstract the **presenting author** needs to be **registered** (including payment) at the Congress: www.cebc2016.com.

Abstracts should be sent to email: pub.cebc@if-pan.krakow.pl.

The abstract must be written in **good English** and checked carefully for typographical errors, misspellings, poor hyphenation, etc.

The abstract should be written using Times New Roman at 12 points and applying single spacing. The abstract needs to be submitted in Word document (.doc or .docx) format and arranged as follows:

Title: A title should be concise but long enough to accurately describe the nature of the study and indicated in bold.

Authors: author's surname before listing the initial letters of names.

Affiliations: full name of institution, town, country (all in italics)

Body text: the body text should contain no more than 2000 characters (including spaces) and be divided into 5 sections indicated in bold (Background, Material and methods, Results, Conclusions, Acknowledgements).

Please do not include **references. Tables and Graphs** are not accepted.
